What are cookies and what do they do?

Cookies are small computer generated files that may be downloaded to your computer's hard drive when you visit a website. These files are harmless. They are designed to improve your browsing experience, provided your browser's preferences are set to permit this. By collecting and remembering your online preferences, the websites you visit can tailor their way of operating to your specific requirements, i.e. what you like or dislike.

There are different types of cookies. Session cookies are temporary and deleted as soon as you close your browser. Persistent cookies are stored on your hard drive until they are being deleted by you or until they expire.

Some cookies are essential and necessary to enable core functionality of a website, for example to provide an online service at someone's request, such as changing language for a page. The website cannot function properly without these cookies, and can only be disabled by changing your browser preferences.

A cookie is also used when a visitor subscribes to a newsletter and ensures the confirmation message shows only once.

Analytical cookies used to collect data about user interaction on our website. These have analytical purpose and help us to see which pages have been frequented and are of most interest to the visitor. This information is collected anonymously, i.e. we don't know who visited and navigated through our website. We don't use any information derived from cookies to identify any individual users.

Examples of cookies used when visiting our website and/or online booking system:

These cookies are used to record the page a visitor has come from and the time they arrived and a unique identifier so this information can be recorded correctly.

[Google Analytics]

These cookies are used to collect information about how visitors use the site. The information is used to compile reports and to help improve the site. The cookies collect information in an anonymous form, including the number of visitors to the site, where visitors have come to the site from and the pages they visited.

Accept and deny cookies: how you can control or delete these cookies

The most web browsers enable cookies automatically as a default setting. By modifying the settings of your internet browser you have the ability to accept or deny cookies from sites. Denying cookies will prevent a site from storing any cookies on your machine (can be turned on or off at any time). However, the functionality of the site may be impaired if cookies are turned off. You should be able to find instructions on how to change these settings through the *Help* feature usually located in the menu bar of your browser.
